

A DISPENSATIONAL CHART

JEW AND GENTILE

“Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond nor free: but Christ is all, and in all.”

~ Colossians 3:11

1. Jew and Gentile in the Beginning

- a. Gen 1:28 - In the beginning there was one man one woman – “be fruitful”
- b. The first mention of the word “nation” – Gen 10:5 – Table of Nations
 - i. The word “Gentile” means nations... but used in contrast to something.
- c. God separated a person, a people, with a promise for a purpose
 - i. Gen 12:1-2 – “a nation” to bless them all;
 - ii. A physical separation a token of the promise - Gen 17:5, 19
 - iii. Israel is the name God gave to Jacob who had twelve sons – Exo 1:1,7

2. A Nation Separated

- a. Israel separated (Exodus 19:5-6-Leviticus 11:23-26-Numbers 23:9 –Deut 7:6-8)
- b. He did not deal so with any other nation - Ps 147:20
- c. Under Solomon Israel was at its peak! 1 Kings 8:34
- d. Even when they failed, they were not treated like other nations – Eze 36:19-22, Mal 1:2

3. Jesus Came to His Own

- a. John came baptizing in the wilderness of Israel – Mal 3:1, Mark 1:2
- b. He came unto his own - John 1:11
- c. Jesus taught Israel’s kingdom – Jerusalem was the city on a hill - Matt 5:13-17
- d. He chose twelve - Matt 10:1, and told them not to go to Gentiles – Matt 10:8
- e. He blessed those who blessed Israel – Luke 7:3-5; Matt 15:22-24
- f. Will you restore the kingdom to Israel? - Acts 1:6

4. A New Creature

- a. Jesus sent Paul to the Gentiles with a message of grace - Acts 22:21
- b. Israel has fallen and salvation is come to Gentiles - Romans 11:11-13
- c. Whether Jew or Gentiles – one body – one Spirit – one hope - 1 Cor 12:13, 27
- d. Out of two he made one new man (miraculously) - Eph 2:11-17, 4:12-13, 4:24
- e. Circumcision does not avail – only a new creature –2Cor 5:17, Gal 6:15
- f. Neither Jew nor Greek – Col 3:11, Gal 3:28, Eph 3:6

5. God Will Keep His Promise to Israel

- a. This is a mystery, until a future time – Rom 11:25-27
- b. A new covenant for Israel – Heb 8:8
- c. Instructions for the twelve tribes - James 1:1
- d. Peter writes to the strangers about their kingdom hope – 1 Pet 1:10
- e. Kings and priests in Jerusalem - Rev 1:6, 20:6, 21:12-14
