## 1. Purpose of Studying 1 Timothy

- a. To place ourselves in Timothy's shoes as he follows Paul's pattern 2 Tim 3:10
- b. To learn Pauline instruction for local church order and operation 1 Cor 14:40
- c. Sound doctrine is important for good behavior in the church 1Co 15:32-33
- d. We can see where the rubber meets the road in Ephesus from 1 Timothy

## 2. What to Expect

- a. <u>Details</u> 6 ch. 113 vs. 2,244 words; "Pastoral epistles", longest to one person
  - i. When in Acts it is written is unknown, but Paul is not in prison 1 Tim 1:3
  - ii. Some things to note Ac 20:1; 1Co 16:11; 2Co 1:1, 1:8, 2:12-13
  - iii. It is surely Pauline and in this dispensation, but its content is contentious
- b. Audience Timothy/Timotheus most mentioned by Paul (>20x)
  - i. Ephesus is a wealthy city filled with false religion, love of power, and money
  - ii. Ephesian elders were warned of false teachers Acts 20:29-30
- c. <u>Purpose</u> To give Tim charge concerning doctrine, deportment, discipline, duty
  - i. "These things I write unto thee ... know how...to behave" 1Ti 3:14-15
  - ii. "by the commandment of God...teach no other doctrine" 1Ti 1:1-3,18, 6:13
  - iii. Timothy becomes entrusted in these epistles 1 Tim 1:11, 6:20
  - iv. Why it's in the Bible? Fills a need in church discipline/leadership under grace
- d. Themes It is a stern and forceful charge (6x) concerning doctrine (9x) 1 Tim 1:3
  - i. Doctrine, teaching, reading, teaching is a frequent topic 1 Tim 4:13,16
    - ii. Paul is concerned about avoiding blasphemy 1 Tim 1:10, 13, 20; 6:1
    - iii. Blasphemy speaking against God by your word, will, works Ro 2:14, Ti 2:5
    - iv. Purity (6x) is mentioned frequently 1 Tim 1:5, 3:9, 5:2, 5:22
    - v. "good work" 12x good profession, good conscience, do good...
    - vi. Good warfare, hold, fight, adversary 1 Tim 1:18, 5:14, 6:12
    - vii. "Good minister" 1 Tim 4:6 concerning warning, doctrine, godliness (9x)
    - viii. 2 "faithful sayings" 1 Tim 1:15, 4:9 1 Timothy is 2 Timothy 2:2 in action
