2. John 6:15-21 – Jesus walks on the water
 - a. Events in the walking of the water:
 - i. Jesus leaves again to the mountain – 6:15
 - ii. Disciples depart separately into the sea – 6:16-17
 - iii. The sea becomes turbulent - 6:18; Mat 14:24
 - iv. Jesus comes in the midst of the storm – 6:19; Mat 14:25
 - b. Compare to:
 - i. Jesus ascension – John 14:2-3; Mark 13:33-34
 - ii. Disciples sent into the tribulation – Mat 10:16; Mk 13:8-9,17-19
 - iii. Jesus’ return in tribulation – Rev 19:11-13
 - iv. Calm in the storm – Matt 8:24-27
3. John 6:22-29 – The people and their search for bread
 - a. The evidence of the miracle – John 6:22-24
 - b. Jesus knew their hearts – John 6:26,28; 2:25
